MORALE BOOST FOR J&K POLICE PERSONNEL**10% OF THE BASIC PAY AS "HARDSHIP ALLOWANCE"
GRANTED IN FAVOUR OF ALL PERSONNEL OF
J&K POLICE W.E.F 01.10.2010**

J&K Government has accorded sanction to the grant of 10% of the Basic Pay as "Hardship Allowance" in favour of all personnel of J&K Police w.e.f 01.10.2010 vide Government Order No. Home-1162(P) of 2010 dated 16.09.2010.

In this context, a message of DGP J&K Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS for information of all personnel of J&K Police is reproduced as under:

"J&K Government, vide order No. Home-1162(P) of 2010 dated 16-09-2010 has sanctioned 10 percent of the Basic pay as Hardship Allowance in favour of all the personnel of J&K Police. This is in recognition of the high level of commitment of the force to meet challenges of militancy, law and order, crime control and other duties of urgent and essential nature. It is also recognition of the sacrifices made by J&K Police and sustained hard work put in by the force and the extreme

hardships faced while responding to the challenges posed by militancy and other duties which has been brought under control to a very large extent specially during the last two years, The Police has also been dealing with the law and order problems with grit and determination in a sustained manner during the period in various parts of the state in which many police man had to sacrifice their lives while huge number suffered injuries in the process. This Government order recognizes the good work of the police in the past and simultaneously it confers on us an added responsibility to stand up effectively to the emerging challenges. It raises the bar for our performance and sets higher bench mark for us to carry out our duties in a more professional and effective manner. In further, our work would be judged on

the basis of higher parameters of performance and conduct. Therefore, we must renew our pledge to considerably improve our force's image and effectiveness and win even more professional laurels in our spheres of work though incidents of militancy have been reduced to a large extent, we need to continue our sustained efforts to wipe out militancy from the state. Several hundred officers and men of our force have made the supreme sacrifice in combating militancy and maintenance of order. We still need to put in dedicated and continued efforts to further improve the situation. Today, let us re-dedicate ourselves to put in our best to dedicatedly serve the people and bring about significant enhancement in the profile of the force and redouble our efforts to bring complete peace to the state".

DGP J&K & PRINCIPAL SECRETARY HOME REVIEWED SECURITY SCENARIO IN DODA RANGE

"Our prime duty is to ensure safety of law abiding citizens and for this purpose good police public relation is mandatory" - DGP J&K

DGP J&K Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS and Principal Secretary Home Shri B.R Sharma IAS convened a high level meeting of police officers at Doda on September 12, 2010 to review the overall law and order and security situation of Doda, Ramban and Kishtwar Districts. The meeting among others was attended by IGP Jammu Zone Shri Ashok Gupta IPS, DIG Doda Range Shri M.K Sinha IPS, SSP Doda Shri Prabhat Singh, SP Kishtwar Dr. Haseeb Mughal, and SP Ramban Shri Mubassir Latifi.

While addressing the meeting, the DGP lauded J&K Police and other security forces for their role in combating the militancy and ensuring rule of law in the state. He stressed upon the officers to improve professional policing, coordinate counter insurgency operations and professional crowd management techniques. Further,

the DGP said that the law and order deployment should be meticulously planned with utmost care with emphasis on command and control to closely monitor and supervise the evolving situation. The DGP also stressed for community policing so that crime detection in these districts is ensured. The DGP also asked the officers that they should give a patient hearing to the grievances of people in their respective jurisdictions as our goal is to serve common man and restore normalcy in the state. He also complimented the role of J&K Police in exhibiting maximum restraint while saving life and property of people. While complimenting the police personnel for their valour, Shri B.R Sharma IAS Principal Secretary Home J&K said that efforts are being made to make the state police force more professional and effective.

On this occasion, Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS DGP J&K also rewarded a number of police personnel for their exemplary role in anti-militancy front and saving life and property of common citizen in the area. 07 constables were given out of turn promotion, 15 SPOs were absorbed as constables in the department besides sanctioning cash rewards to various police components of three districts of the Range.

DGP J&K also held a police durbar at DPL Doda in which jawans and officers of all the three districts attended. While addressing the durbar, the DGP assured the jawans that the department was fully aware about the difficulties of their men and in this direction department had already taken various measures for the welfare of serving and retired police officers, jawans and their families.

ACHIEVEMENTS ON ANTI-MILITANCY FRONT

During the month of September 2010, J&K Police eliminated 19 hardcore militants, apprehended 06 militants and effected the surrender of 01 militant besides recovery of a huge quantity of arms and ammunition during various encounters/search operations across the State. The recovered arms and ammunition include 22 AK-47/56 rifles, 55 AK magazines, 1515 AK rounds, 01 SLR, 40 SLR rounds,

08 pistols, 01 pistol magazine, 17 pistol rounds, 30 hand grenades, 01 RPG round, 01 I-Com antenna, 02 Gas Cylinders, 03 Radio sets, 06 UBGLs, 14 UBGL grenades, 03 wireless sets, 01 compass, 28 kg explosive, 01 Thurrya Set, 02 Battaries, 06 pencil cells, two 12-bore guns, 03 Gelatin sticks, 02 mobile phones and Rs.1600/- Indian currency.

725 CONSTABLES OF J&K ARMED POLICE PROMOTED AS SG. CONSTABLES

Shri K. Rajendra Kumar IPS ADGP Armed/ Law and order J&K issued the promotion orders of 725 Constables of Armed/IRP Battalions to the rank of Selection grade constables in the pay scale of 5200-20200 with applicable grade pay on September 10, 2010 after their cases were cleared by the departmental promotion committee.

DPC cell in APHQ comprising of Shri Mehboob-ul-Haq Insp.(P) APHQ, SI(M) Mushtaq Ahmad , HC Mohd. Sidiq, HC Tara Singh and Computer Operator Tawheed Ahmad worked day and night and accomplished the assignment within 10 days stipulated time. The news about promotion of 725 constables was published in the leading local dailies of the state on September 11, 2010. The promoted officials expressed their happiness on getting promoted on such an auspicious occasion of Eid-ul-Fitr.
