DGP VISITED SOUTH KASHMIR HELD HIGH LEVEL MEETING REVIEWED SECURITY SITUATION

Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS Director General of Police J&K accompanied by IGP Kashmir Shri Farooq Ahmed IPS visited South Kashmir on July 27, 2010.

During the visit, the DGP J&K chaired a high level meeting of Police Officers of South Kashmir at District Police Lines Anantnag to review the security situation in the districts of South Kashmir.

While addressing the meeting, the DGP stressed upon the police officers to evolve an effective mechanism and planning for dealing with the situations. He also stressed for greater synergy at all levels.

While appreciating the role of Jammu and Kashmir police the DGP said that while facing the abnormal situation in the state during the last 20 years J&K Police has dealt with courage and fortitude and always ensured to avoid loss of life and property of law abiding people. He stressed upon the officers present in the meeting to maintain

close co-ordination within their ranks and other security forces to achieve better results in defusing the tension in their respective jurisdictions.

The DGP reiterated that people of the State cannot be left at the mercy of the miscreants who are adamant to disrupt peace and tranquility in the State. He asked the officers to curb these elements with firm hand. He further said that while dealing with the situations it should be ensured that the law abiding citizens are not harassed at any cost. He also asked the officers to keep vigil on the activities of rumor mongers and curb their activities.

Stressing the need for greater synergy between the police and security forces, the DGP said that this could be done by having regular meetings at various levels. He asked the officers to interact with the senior citizens in their respective areas which could help in dealing the situation in a befitting manner. He said that the local problems of the people could be heard and addressed by this way. He further said that the senior police officers at the district level should be kept apprised about the day-to-day situations so that necessary guidance and feedback is provided to respond to any emerging situation. He also called for proper

deployment of manpower in the required areas.

Earlier, Inspector General of Police, Kashmir Zone, Shri Farooq Ahmad IPS briefed the meeting about law and order situation in the districts of South Kashmir. Deputy Inspector General of Police, (South Kashmir Range), Shri Shafqat Watali IPS also briefed the meeting about the situation in the region. Whereas, SP, Anantnag, Bashir Ahmad Khan gave detailed power point presentation about the law and order situation in district Anantnag.

The meeting also reviewed security and traffic arrangements made with regard to ongoing Shri Amar Nath Ji Annual Yatra. The meeting was informed that all necessary arrangements have been made for smooth flow of traffic en-route holy cave so that the pilgrims do not face any inconvenience during their journey.

The DGP stressed for close coordination among all agencies for ensuring better security arrangements for the Yatra.

Among others, the meeting was attended by SP Kulgam, Shri Keshavram Chourisia, Commandants of Armed Police and CRPF of the South Kashmir based battalions and other police officers.

DGP J&K SANCTIONED RS.1,18,23,280/-IN FAVOUR OF SERVING POLICE PERSONNEL/NOKs OF POLICE MARTYRS UNDER VARIOUS WELFARE SCHEMES

During the month of July 2010, Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS Director General of Police J&K has accorded sanction to the grant of Special Welfare relief of Rs.84 lacs in favour of NOKs of 14 deceased police personnel: welfare loan of Rs.1, 35,000 in favour of 10 serving police personnel; Ex-gratia relief of Rs.30.00 lacs in favour of NOKs of 10 police Martyrs (Funds provided by MHA, GOI New Delhi); Scholarship of Rs.2, 33,400 to 82 wards of 34 police Martyrs; Scholarship of Rs.19, 200 to 16 wards of 10 deceased police personnel; Welfare Relief of Rs. 13,000 in favour of 02 serving police personnel; Meritorious Scholarship of Rs. 22,680 to 27 wards of serving police personnel studying in class 8th.

On July 29, 2010, the Director General of Police J&K Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS sanctioned scholarships amounting to Rs.2.50 Lakhs out of Central Police Welfare Fund in favour of 123 school going children of police personnel who have secured distinction in class 8th and 9th during the academic year 2009-2010.

The 123 wards who were given scholarships include 55 wards of serving police personnel who have secured 75 percent and above marks in class 8th and 9th and 68 wards of Martyrs/deceased police personnel who are studying in different classes from 1st Primary to Graduation level in different educational institutions across the state.

DGP J&K AWARDED MERITORIOUS SCHOLARSHIPS TO 123 WARDS OF POLICE PERSONNEL

While awarding the scholarships, the DGP said that the objective of granting scholarships is to boost the talent among the children so that they could compete in different educational streams in future. He stressed upon the parents/guardians to make best use of these scholarships for future studies of their children as in the present times one has to face tough competition to find any place in a discipline.

The DGP further said that police organization has started so many schemes under its welfare programme for the welfare of serving police personnel and the families of police martyrs besides efforts to provide better educational facilities to the wards of police personnel.

The department is fully aware of the fact that the police personnel often remains away from their homes in the service of the nation and their families do not get the required care. Hence it is responsibility of the organization to encourage the wards of these personnel for competing various competitive examinations for their better career prospects, Shri Kuldeep Khoda IPS DGP J&K added.

APPLICATION INVITED FOR DGP'S SPECIAL REWARD

In terms of Rule 3(f) of Central Police Welfare Fund Revised Rules-2004, annual DGP's special reward is given out of the Central Police Welfare Fund to the wards of serving police personnel of J&K Police who secures highest marks (but not less than 60%) at the level of Matriculation, 10+2 and Graduation to inculcate the spirit of healthy competition. Each reward

comprises of Rs.5000/- alongwith meritorious certificate and is limited to two rewards each for Matric, 10+2 & Graduation class for the wards of Gazetted Officers, 03 rewards each for Matric, 10+2 & Graduation class for the wards of Non Gazetted Officers (NGOs) and 08 rewards each for Matric, 10+2 & Graduation class for the wards of other ranks.

With the above background, applications alongwith relevant marks cards indicating % age of marks secured by the eligible wards of serving police personnel duly

authenticated/attested by Head of the Unit are invited by PHQ J&K Srinagar. The cases after proper verification are required to be forwarded to PHQ by concerned Unit Head by or before 20th August, 2010, after which no case shall be entertained. The applications already submitted to PHQ need not to be resubmitted. The academic year for Kashmir Division shall be taken from October-2008 to November 2009 and for Jammu Division from March-2009 to April, 2010.

JAMMU CITY POLICE WORKED OUT SEVERAL THEFT CASES

Jammu City Police worked out several theft cases on the disclosure of four thieves arrested by Jammu City Police involved in theft, chain snatching and motor bike lifting cases on July 27, 2010.

The accused arrested were Gourav Sachdeva Son of Devender Sachdeva of R.S.Pura, Sanjeev Kumar S/o Des Raj of Udampur. Tarun Sharma S/O Sushil Kumar of Pir Mitha and Ankush Sharma S/O Anil Khajuria of Pir Mitha. Recoveries made from the arrested accused include 02 Motor Cycles, 08 Nokia Mobile Phones, one Lap top and a gold chain.

Accused Gourav and Sanjeev had stolen one motor Cycle each from city areas whereas the accused Tarun had stolen 08 mobile phones from different parts of the Jammu city and Ankush has stolen one lap top and snatched a gold chain from a woman. The investigation also revealed that these thieves were also committing thefts in Govt. Medical College Hospital and SMGSH premises by stealing the mobile phones and cash of patients and their attendants.

SKPA UDHAMPUR ORGANIZED 'E-GOVERNANCE' COURSE

A course on 'e-Governance' organized by Sher-i-Kashmir Police Academy Udhampur for Senior Superintendents of Police and Superintendents of Police of various wings of the State Police was inaugurated by Shri Navin Agarwal IPS Director Police Academy Udhampur on July 17, 2010.

This course was designed especially for drawing and disbursing officers of J K Police.

While inaugurating the course, Director SKPA Udhampur Shri Navin Agarwal, IPS emphasized that Police is a machinery of government with the responsibility of maintaining law and order, enforcement of fundamental rights, preservation and detection of crime etc. He said that 'e-governance presents challenges and opportunities to transform both the mechanics of government and nature of governance itself.

E-Governance is actually the use of modern Information and Communication Technologies such as Internet, Local Area Network, mobiles etc by Government to improve the effectiveness, efficiency, Service delivery and to promote democracy. E-Government (short for Electronic Government, also known as E-gov, digital Government, on line government, connected government and cheap interaction between Government and citizens, business and enterprises and relationship between governments.

Besides, a ten days capsule course for Deputy Directors of Forest Protection Force was also held at SKPA Udhampur. The course was inaugurated by Shri Navin Agarwal IPS Director Police Academy Udhampur. Shri Vinod Ranjan IFS Director Forest Protection Force was the Chief Guest on the occasion. The main objective of the course was to refresh physical activities and training of the forest officers as an armed force. During the course they were taught about criminal procedure code, Fire arms Act, JK forest Act, Wild Life Act, Forest Protection Act, Forest Conservation Act and other Acts.

also present in the meet. During the meeting, besides discussing the other important issues concerning to general public the main stress was laid on the drug abuse in which police sought cooperation of public to curb the menace.

The people also raised their demands for upgradation of police post Sarwal to police station and proper management of heavy rush of vehicles at Rehari Chungi Chowk to ensure smooth flow of traffic.

A similar police-public meet attended by a large number of gathering comprising senior citizen of the locality and senior police officers of the police jurisdiction was held at R.K Palace near Peer Baba Chatha under the chairmanship of SP South Shri Rajeshwar Singh.

During the meeting problems of over loading in minibuses, eve teasing, Bhukki and use of other types of drugs by the youth were discussed and deliberate. Speaking in the meeting SP Rajesh war Singh appealed the gathering to help police in giving information about miscreants creating problems for locals and assured them timely police help.

DURATION OF UPPER COURSE SHORTENED

Duration of upper course of pre promotion courses of Assistant Sub Inspectors of J&K Police(Executive Cadre) for the promotion of Sub Inspector has been shortened from six months to four months and new syllabus for the same has been prepared in which new challenges required to be faced by SHOs have also been included. This was stated by Shri Navin Agarwal IPS IGP-cum-Director SKPA Udhampur while inaugurating upper course for Assistant Sub-Inspectors and Station House Officer at SKPA Udhampur on July 01, 2010.

While addressing the participants of the course, Shri Navin

Agarwal IPS Director PTA Udhampur said that It is for the first time that the duration of the upper course has been curtailed from six months to four months which has been made possible by improved training methodologies and better time management. He said that Police Stations are basic units of police functioning and Station House officers (SHOs) must consider themselves responsible for maintenance of law and order in their jurisdictions. Director PTA Udhampur stressed upon the participating ASIs from various police stations of the

State to cope with the revised pace of time and fast track nature of this course. During this course the participants would be specially groomed regarding the challenges which the SHOs should be able to handle, whether it is prevention and detection of crime or maintenance of public peace and order or redressal of public grievances for collection of intelligence within his jurisdiction, surveillance of bad character, co-ordination with paramilitary forces placed at his disposal to assist him in maintenance of law and order- Shri Navin Agarwal IPS Director SKPA Udhampur added.

MAN IMPERSONATING AS PM'S ADVISOR EXPOSED

A man impersonating as advisor to P.M was exposed by J&K Police at Katra on July 13, 2010. The fake advisor to PM identified as Manmohan Singh S/O Arjun Singh R/O 115-A Fateh Nagar near Hari Nagar New Delhi has however succeeded in taking undue advantage of security cover and other VVIP protocol/ facilities in a couple of states before his arrest by Katra Police for impersonating as P.M's advisor.

The impersonator was booked under section 419, 420 & 170 RPC under FIR No. 141/2010 of P/S Katra. The impersonator was however bailed out for this case registered at P/S Katra and handed over to a Delhi Police Team headed by Tuglakabad Police Station SHO Surinder Koli as the fake advisor was also reportedly wanted to Delhi Police in connection with an FIR registered against him at Tuglakabad P/S under section 451, 34 & 353 IPC for beating a PSO of Union Food processing Minister Shri Subodhkant Sahay on July 10, 2010.

The modes-operandi of the impersonator was that he himself used to ring up senior police officers of a particular state posing himself as Narinder Sharma Private Secretary to Advisor to PM and would tell them to make all arrangements for stay of the Advisor in a particular state as a state guest.

Katra Police has indeed done a commendable work in trapping the impersonator by exhibiting due diligence, presence of mind & timely action.

ACHIEVEMENTS ON ANTI-MILITANCY FRONT

During the month of July 2010, J&K Police eliminated 08 hardcore militants and apprehended 05 militants besides recovery of a huge quantity of arms and ammunition during various encounters/search operations across the State. The recovered arms and ammunition include 07 AK-47 rifles, 25 AK-47 magazines, 472 AK rounds, 01 Pistol, 01 Pistol magazine, 05 pistol rounds, 04 binocular, 28 UBGL shells, 04 UBGL launchers, 28 Hand grenades, 65 kg RDX, 22 Gelatin rods, 30 mtrs. cordex wire, 09 empty cartridges, 3 kg explosive powder, 399 Pika rounds, 01 Rocket launcher, 168 pencil cell, 41 detonators, 47 IED circuits, one .303 rifle with one magazine and 14 rounds, 14 Anti-personnel mines, 03 pouches, 01 fire pin, 05 RPG, 09 RC-IED box, 35 fuses, 01 grenade thrower and 06 PEK stick besides Rs.20,000/- Indian currency, 10 wireless sets, 03 Antennas, 07 mobile phones with six SIM cards, 05 LPG cylinders and 01 radio set.

جموں و کشمیر پولیس



یوم آزادی کی تقریب منعقد کرنے کے سلسلے میں انتظامات کی تفصیل کو حتمی شکل دینے کیلئے ریاستی مسلح پولیس کے سربراہ جناب دلہاغ سنگھ IPS، ۲۷ جولائی ۲۰۱۰ء کو سرینگر میں اعلیٰ پولیس افسران کی میٹنگ سے خطاب کرتے ہوئے۔

جموں و کشمیر آرمڈ پولیس تاریخ کے آئینے میں

وقت گزرنے کے ساتھ ساتھ آرمڈ پولیس کے فرمائش گونا گوں محازوں پر بڑھتے گئے۔ ان فرمائش میں ریاست جموں و کشمیر میں دہشت گردی مخالف کاروائیاں، امن و قانون کی بحالی، اندرونی سلامتی، اقلیتی فرقہ کی حفاظت، حساس مقامات کی حفاظت، VIP سکیورٹی، شہری امرتاھتہ جی کی سالانہ یا تراکے دوران ڈیوٹیاں، پارلیمانی و اسمبلی چناؤ و دیگر متعدد فرمائش شامل ہیں۔ بڑھتی دہشت گردی اور بڑھتے امن و قانون کے مسکوں کے پیش نظر جب ریاست میں مزید پولیس فورس کی ضرورت محسوس کی گئی تو ریاستی حکومت نے مرکزی حکومت کی وساطت سے 1994ء سے اب تک کل ملا کر IRP کی 20 بٹالینیں کھڑی کیں۔ یعنی جموں و کشمیر آرمڈ پولیس اور IRP کی اس وقت ریاست میں 31 بٹالینیں متذکرہ بالا فرمائش سرانجام دے رہی ہیں۔ ریاست کی اس پولیس فورس نے ہر محاز پر اپنا لوہا منوایا۔ خواہ دہشت گردی کے خلاف جنگ ہو، امن و قانون کی بحالی ہو، اندرونی سلامتی ہو یا دورے امن میں کھیل کود کا مقابلہ ہو۔ جموں و کشمیر آرمڈ پولیس کے افسران و جوان اپنے پیشہ وارانہ فرمائش کی انجام دہی میں ہمیشہ پیش پیش رہتے ہیں۔

جموں و کشمیر آرمڈ پولیس کی تواریخ سے بخوبی چند حقائق اسپیڈ پر پتل APHQ جناب محبوب الحق نے فراہم کی ہیں جس کے لئے کاتب تہمدل سے شکور ہے۔

جموں و کشمیر مسلح پولیس ریاست جموں و کشمیر کی ایک خصوصی پولیس فورس ہے۔ جو کہ امن و قانون کی بحالی اور اندرونی سلامتی کے لئے بنائی گئی تھی۔ آزادی سے قبل بنائی گئی ریاست کی اس پولیس فورس کی دو بٹالینوں کو ابتدا میں کشمیر پیپلز پولیس کے نام سے جانا جاتا تھا۔ آزادی کے بعد ان دو بٹالینوں کو بارڈر سکیورٹی فورس میں مدغم کر لیا گیا۔ سنہ 1957 میں کشمیر پیپلز پولیس کی تیسری بٹالین کھڑی کی گئی جس کو جموں کشمیر آرمڈ پولیس کا نام دیا گیا۔

وقت گزرنے کے ساتھ جموں و کشمیر آرمڈ پولیس کی تعداد میں اضافہ کیا جاتا رہا اور اس طرح 1992ء تک جموں و کشمیر آرمڈ پولیس کی کل چودہ بٹالینیں کھڑی ہوئیں۔ جس میں سے دسویں بٹالین کی بھرتی شدہ کل نفری کو ریاستی ضلع پولیس میں مدغم کر لیا گیا۔ غرض کہ موجودہ وقت میں جموں و کشمیر آرمڈ پولیس کی موجودہ گیارہ بٹالینیں ریاست میں کام کر رہی ہیں۔

چھپٹے بیس سالوں میں یعنی 1989ء سے لیکر اب تک ریاست جموں و کشمیر میں بل عموماً اور وادی کشمیر میں بل خصوصاً دہشت گردی کا دور دورہ رہا۔ اس دہشت گردی سے نجات حاصل کرنے کے لئے ریاستی پولیس کے سینکڑوں افسروں اور جوانوں نے اپنی قیمتی جانوں کا نظرانہ پیش کیا۔ ان شہیدوں میں جموں و کشمیر آرمڈ پولیس کے افسروں و جوانوں کی ایک کثیر تعداد شامل ہے۔
